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

I. INTRODUCTION

A. APPLICATION SUMMARY

T2 Inc. (KAR Investments, LLC) submitted concurrent applications for a Comprehensive Plan (Plan) map amendment, a Plan text amendment, and a Zoning map amendment on three properties totaling 10.89 acres.

The subject properties are zoned Farm/Forest (F/F). The current *Plan* map designation is Farm/Forest. The amendments would change the *Plan* designation on the subject properties from Farm/Forest to Industrial and change the zoning from F/F to Heavy Industrial (HI). The proposed amendments would include the subject properties as part of Industrial Exception area I-23, MK Forest Products.

The application also includes a *Plan* text amendment for a goal exception. The applicant proposes a "reasons" exception to Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4. The proposed *Plan* text amendment would amend Linn County Code (LCC) Chapter 905.

If the proposed amendments are adopted, the applicant proposes to expand their existing wood pellet manufacturing operation on an adjacent property onto the subject properties (See site plan, **Exhibit A, pages 9-14**). Application of the HI zone to the property will allow the property to be further developed in conjunction with the adjacent wood products manufacturing facility. The proposed development will include three new pellet mills, one rotary dryer, and storage for raw and finished products, including sawdust, chips, and pellets. The pellet mill and dryer expansion are expected to add 20 new jobs, including front end loader and machinery operators, employees for bagging and stacking pellets, forklift drivers, and shipping and receiving personnel.

The applicant has submitted information to address the applicable decision criteria, the *Plan* policies, Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR), and the Statewide Planning Goals. The applications and applicant submittals are attached to this staff report as **Exhibit A**.

B. PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Commission (Commission) held a public hearing on this matter at 7:00 p.m., October 10, 2023. After considering the staff analysis and the written and oral testimony presented at the Commission hearing, **the Commission voted 6-0 to adopt a motion to recommend that the Board approve the proposed amendments.** Voting in favor of the motion were Commissioners Alderman, Barnard, Boshart, Cromwell, Legras, and Stutzman.

C. DECISION CRITERIA AND ANALYSIS

The applicable decision criteria are set forth in Linn County Code (LCC) 921.822, 921.872, and 921.874; Exception criteria are set forth in Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 660-004-0020 and OAR 660-004-0022. The decision criteria are attached to this report in **Exhibit B.**

Section 921.822(A) – Decision criteria for Zoning map amendments

LCC 921.822(A): When a Zoning Map or Land Development Code text amendment is necessary due to a proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment, only findings and conclusions responding to the Comprehensive Plan amendment criteria for decision are necessary to amend the Zoning Map or Code text provisions.

STAFF ANALYSIS: The application includes both a *Plan* map amendment and a zoning map amendment. Information addressing the *Plan* map amendment criteria is found below. Compliance with the applicable *Plan* amendment criteria will satisfy this criterion.

Section 921.872 - Decision criteria for Plan Text amendments

LCC 921.872: To approve a Plan text amendment, the following criteria shall be met:

(A) The amendment is consistent with the intent of the applicable section(s) of the Comprehensive Plan; and

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant statement addressing this criterion can be found in **Exhibit A, pages 47-59**.

(B) The amendment is consistent with the statewide planning goals.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant statement addressing this criterion can be found in **Exhibit A, pages 61-67**.

STAFF ANALYSIS: The properties have been zoned Farm/Forest (F/F) since September 2, 1980. In addition to the Plan sections sited by the applicant, additional applicable sections of the *Plan* include the Farm/Forest Lands section and specific policies in the Industrial Lands section of the Land Use Element Code Chapter 905.

LCC Section 905.330 (Policies for farm/forest lands) identifies applicable *Plan* policies implementing Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4. LCC Section 905.330(G) states:

"Conversion of lands designated as Farm/Forest in the Comprehensive Plan to a different plan designation requires a Comprehensive Plan amendment and a goal exception. Both Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4 shall apply unless the applicant submits evidence that the property is clearly not protected by one of the goals. This evidence must be part of any application. If sufficient evidence is submitted to indicate that either Goal 3 or 4 does not apply, the applicant shall still be required to take exception to the other applicable goal in the Farm/Forest zone. This Plan amendment process entails a hearing before the Planning Commission and the Board of Commissioners and is open to the public. This process provides the opportunity to assess the merits of the proposal and determine potential impacts on nearby resource land."

LCC Section 905.330(G) describes the process for conversion of a tract or parcel that is designated as Farm/Forest land on the *Plan* map to a different *Plan* designation, and that such process requires an exception to Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4 and a *Plan* amendment.

LCC Section 905.560 (Goals for Industrial lands) states, "[Industrial lands] (A) Provide for the orderly development of land for rural industrial uses. (B) Recognize identified industrial operations as viable county land uses. (C) Provide opportunities for diverse rural economic development."

LCC 905.570(B)(8) (Policies for industrial lands) states, "The expansion of existing industry is encouraged. Expansion onto resource land may be permitted through the Plan amendment and exception process."

An exception to Statewide Planning Goal 3 (Agricultural Lands) and Statewide Planning Goal 4 (Forest Lands) is required. The exception to Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4 is needed because the applicant is proposing to change a resource *Plan* map designation (Farm/Forest) and resource zoning district (F/F) to a non-resource *Plan* designation and zoning district. The amendment proposes to change to a development *Plan* map designation (Industrial) and a development zoning district (HI).

The applicant has proposed a "reasons" exception and submitted findings to demonstrate what reasons justify why the state policy embodied in the applicable goals (Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4) does not apply. The applicable criteria for a reasons exception can be found in OAR 660-004-0020 and OAR 660-004-0022. The applicant provides analysis addressing the goal exception criteria in **Exhibit A**, pages 69-102.

Applicable statewide planning goals include Goals 1 through 15. The applicant statement sufficiently addresses Goals 1, 2, and 5 through 15. Exceptions are proposed to Goals 3 and 4. Statewide Planning Goals 16-19 are not applicable because Linn County does not contain any estuaries, coastal shorelines, beaches or dunes.

<u>Section 921.874 - Decision criteria for Plan map amendments</u> LCC 921.874(A)(1): The amendment is consistent with and does not alter the intent of applicable section(s) of the Comprehensive Plan.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant states: "This Plan map amendment application is submitted in conjunction with a Plan text amendment application to adopt exceptions to Goal 3 and Goal 4. Plan text amendment application Exhibit 2 addresses this criterion in full. The facts and proposed findings contained in Plan text amendment application Exhibit 2 demonstrate the amendment is consistent with and does not alter the intent of applicable sections of the Comprehensive Plan; and that the Plan map amendment satisfies the criterion in LCC 921.874(A)(1)."

STAFF ANALYSIS: This criterion is addressed in the application materials and staff report above as part of the decision criteria contained in LCC Section 921.872.

LCC 921.874(A)(2): The amendment will be compatible with adjacent uses and will not adversely impact the overall land use pattern in the area.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant statement addressing this criterion can be found in **Exhibit A, pages 24-26**.

STAFF ANALYSIS: Adjacent properties are zoned HI and F/F. The proposed amendments would include the subject properties as part of Industrial Exception area I-23, MK Forest Products, the adjacent property also owned by the applicant.

There are twenty properties within 1,000 feet of the subject property. The land to the north is zoned HI and is developed with wood products manufacturing facilities. North of the mill is a rural residential exception area, which is roughly one-quarter mile from the proposed mill expansion. The land to the west is a railroad right-of-way, with a five-lane interstate highway west of the railroad.

The land to the east is open space comprised of wetland and wooded areas. Those lands are down a steep embankment from the property. It is not physically possible to expand

any form of land use from the development site onto the adjacent property to the east, or vice versa. The operation of rural industrial uses at the site, with the identified measures to reduce adverse impacts, will ensure those resource lands will not be committed to a non-resource use.

Properties to the south are developed with homesites and include sparsely wooded areas. The site plan demonstrates that the mill expansion will take place near the northern boundary of the property, away from the residential uses to the south. In addition, sufficient buffering, noise barriers and other mitigation measures, such as downward-shielded lighting, will be implemented to prevent significant impacts in all directions. Rural industrial development of the property is proposed to incorporate the identified mitigation measures and ensure areas to the south of the exception site do not experience significant adverse impacts.

LCC 921.874(A)(3): The amendment, if within an adopted urban growth boundary, is in substantial conformity with the Comprehensive Plan and implementing ordinances of an affected city.

STAFF ANALYSIS: The property is not located within an adopted urban growth boundary; therefore, this criterion is not applicable.

LCC 921.874(A)(4): The amendment will not have a significant adverse impact on a sensitive fish or wildlife habitat.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The application states: "The Comprehensive Plan wildlife habitat maps indicate the property does not contain and is not adjacent to any sensitive fish or wildlife habitat areas. The nearest sensitive fish habitat is the South Santiam River, which is approximately one-quarter mile to the east. There is an inventoried wetland east of the property. However, the wetland is located a significant distance below the upper terrace area where all development will occur.

The physical separation of the wetland from the development area, and the stormwater and pollution control measures that will be implemented in conjunction with any development of the site, ensure that the wetland and other land will not be impacted. These facts demonstrate that the amendment will not have a significant adverse impact on a sensitive fish or wildlife habitat and the Plan map amendment satisfies the criterion in LCC 921.874(A)(4)."

STAFF ANALYSIS: There are no sensitive fish or wildlife habitats on the subject property. An inventoried wetland is located on the southeast corner of tax lot 402. Linn County Code protects wetland areas with a 50-foot structural setback standard from the top of the bank of the riparian area for all new development. Additional on-site mitigation may occur during development depending on requirements of Oregon Department of State Lands (DSL). The DSL was notified of the proposed amendment and submitted comments indicating that a wetland delineation for tax lots 402 and 400 was completed in 2021 (WD2021-0659), which identified wetlands. DSL comments state that it appears the proposed work shows impacts to tax lot 400, and would require a permit and associated mitigation (**Exhibit C**, **pages 1-2**).

LCC 921.874(A)(5): The amendment will not have a significant adverse impact upon the provision of public facilities including police and fire protection, sanitary facilities and storm drainage facilities.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The application states: "The amendment will limit the uses, density, public facilities and services, and activities to only those that are permitted within the HI zoning district, consistent with the property development limitations and requirements in the land development code. The application demonstrates that the rural industrial use of the site will not require new public facilities and services and will not impact existing public facilities and services.

The property is within the Sweet Home Fire District. The uses will not significantly impact the fire district because the site contains onsite fire suppression vehicles and equipment, water storage for fire suppression, firefighting tools, and employees who are trained in fire suppression. The tract contains two existing wells that can be used for fire suppression. The property is flat or gently sloping, is easily accessible to firefighting equipment, and is developed with hard, fire-resistant surfaces. In addition, the operation includes 24-hour onsite employee monitoring including a night watchman.

Water and sewer systems are provided on-site by existing wells and a DEQ-approved sewer system. Electrical service is provided by Pacific Power. The development will not utilize any other public facilities and services. The property will be developed in compliance with the attached stormwater pollution protection and drainage plan, which will be reviewed by DEQ and the County Building Official.

The rural industrial site development does not require and does not include any offsite improvements, environmental restrictions, or additional public facilities or services. These facts demonstrate that the amendment will not have a significant adverse impact upon the provision of public facilities and that the Plan map amendment satisfies the criterion in LCC 921.874(A)(5)."

STAFF ANALYSIS: Police protection for the property is provided by the Linn County Sheriff's Department. The property is located within the Sweet Home Rural Fire Protection District and receives fire protection from the district. The Linn County Sherriff's Office and the Sweet Home Rural Fire Department were notified of the proposed amendments. Neither agency submit comments indicating impacts as a result of the amendments as of the time this staff report was prepared.

The proposed use requires a permitted public water system. A public water system is defined in OAR 333-061-0020 as "a system for the provision to the public of piped water for human consumption, if such system has more than three service connections, or supplies water to a public or commercial establishment that operates a total of at least 60 days per year, and that is used by 10 or more individuals per day". The Oregon Health Authority Public Drinking Water Program regulates water quality and quantity for public water systems. The proposed use would need to maintain compliance with Drinking Water program requirements in order to operate. Oregon Water Resources Department (WRD) regulates permits to appropriate public water. Oregon WRD was notified of the proposed amendments and did not submit comments as of the date this staff report was prepared.

On-site sanitation and wastewater is regulated by Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and the Linn County Environmental Health Program (EHP). The EHP was notified of the

proposed amendments and did not submit comments as of the date this staff report was prepared.

Storm water drainage is typically addressed when site development commences. Development is required to provide for storm water drainage, which is not permitted to flow directly onto adjoining properties. The applicant has submitted a drainage plan as part of the application materials (Exhibit A, pages 9-14). Development of the property may require compliance with applicable provisions in LCC Chapter 860 (Surface Waters Code). The Linn County Road Department may require a review of the stormwater and drainage plan as part of site development.

LCC 921.874(A)(6): The amendment will not have a significant adverse impact upon the transportation facilities.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant statement addressing this criterion can be found in **Exhibit A, pages 27-28**.

STAFF ANALYSIS: The application states that access to the property will be via Highway 20 onto the adjacent mill property using the existing ODOT-approved and regulated access; then following established internal circulation roads. The existing highway access is the only access to the property aside from an emergency access located at the southern end of the property.

ODOT regulates access and traffic control along state highways. Any new development on the property would be subject to ODOT review and permitting requirements and reviewed prior to site development. The Linn County Road Department may require a driveway review as part of site development. The construction of the driveway is reviewed by the Road Department to ensure that emergency vehicles have adequate access the property. ODOT was provided notice of the proposal and did not submit comments indicating any road related impacts as a result of the amendment as of the time this staff report was prepared. The Road Department comments did not express concern regarding the proposed amendments (Exhibit C, page 3).

The application materials state that the applicant is in the process of obtaining a State Highway Approach permit to include the subject property in the existing grant of access. Although there is an existing approach at this location, an application for a grant of access is needed as the approach proposes to include the additional tax lots. The ODOT will review transportation impacts when it processes the permit.

LCC 921.874(A)(7): The presence of any development limitations including geologic hazards, flood hazards or water quality or quantity will not have a significant adverse impact on land uses permitted through the amendment.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant statement addressing this criterion states: "According to the Plan inventories of natural and geologic hazards the site is not subject to known flooding, ponding, high ground water, mass movement, or fire hazards. The Comprehensive Plan geologic hazard area maps (<u>Bulletin 84, Environmental Geology of Western Linn County Oregon</u>) do not identify any geologic hazards or mass movement topography on or near the property. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study for Linn County, Oregon and Incorporated Areas dated September 29, 2010, indicates the affected property is not located within a designated flood hazard area. The

property is served by two onsite wells and includes firefighting equipment, including water storage.

These facts demonstrate that there are no known development limitations, including geologic hazards, flood hazards or water quality or quantity, that would have a significant adverse effect on land uses permitted through the amendment. The Plan map amendment therefore satisfies the criterion in LCC 921.874(A)(7)".

STAFF ANALYSIS: There are no potential geologic hazards identified on the subject property; therefore, there should be no significant adverse geologic hazard related effects on land uses permitted through this amendment.

A portion of the southeast corner of tax lot 402 is located within the special flood hazard area, specifically unnumbered Flood Zone A. Based on the site plan submitted with the application, the location of proposed work is outside the mapped flood hazard area. Any work proposed within the flood hazard area must comply with the floodplain development standards in LCC Chapter 870 (Floodplain Management Code).

The proposed use requires a permitted public water system. A public water system is defined in OAR 333-061-0020 as "a system for the provision to the public of piped water for human consumption, if such system has more than three service connections, or supplies water to a public or commercial establishment that operates a total of at least 60 days per year, and that is used by 10 or more individuals per day". The Oregon Health Authority Public Drinking Water Program regulates water quality and quantity for public water systems. The proposed use would need to maintain compliance with Drinking Water program requirements in order to operate. Oregon Water Resources Department (WRD) regulates permits to appropriate public water. Oregon WRD was notified of the proposed amendments and did not submit comments as of the date this staff report was prepared.

LCC 921.874(A)(8): An exception to the statewide planning goals is not required. If required, then findings have been prepared to meet the exception criteria.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant states: "The statewide planning goals are addressed in Plan text amendment application, which is being submitted concurrently with this application. The analysis and conclusions in Plan text amendment application Exhibit 3 are included here by reference as a response to this criterion. This Plan map amendment requires exceptions to statewide planning Goal 3 and Goal 4. The findings in Plan text amendment application Exhibit 4 demonstrate compliance with this criterion and are included herein by reference. The referenced facts and findings demonstrate that the Plan map amendment satisfies the criterion in LCC 921.874(A)(8)."

STAFF ANALYSIS: This criterion is addressed in the application materials and staff report above as part of the decision criteria contained in LCC Section 921.872. The applicable criteria for a reasons exception can be found in OAR 660-004-0020 and OAR 660-004-0022. The applicant provides analysis addressing the goal exception criteria in Exhibit A, pages 69-102.LCC 921.874(A)(9): The amendment is consistent with the statewide planning goals.

APPLICANT STATEMENT: The applicant states: "The statewide planning goals are addressed in Plan text amendment application Exhibit 3, which accompanies this application. The analysis and conclusions in Plan text amendment application Exhibit 3 are included herein by reference as a response to this criterion. This Plan map amendment requires exceptions

to statewide planning Goal 3 and Goal 4. The findings in Plan text amendment application Exhibit 4 demonstrate compliance with this criterion and are included herein by reference. The referenced facts and findings demonstrate that the Plan map amendment satisfies the criterion in LCC 921.874(A) (9)."

STAFF ANALYSIS: Applicable statewide planning goals include Goals 1 through 15. Statewide Planning Goals 16-19 are not applicable because Linn County does not contain any estuaries, coastal shorelines, beaches or dunes.

The proposed amendments require an exception to Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 4. The goal exception criteria in OAR are addressed as part of the criterion in LCC 921.872. The applicable criteria for a reasons exception can be found in OAR 660-004-0020 and OAR 660-004-0022. The applicant provides analysis addressing the goal exception criteria in **Exhibit A, pages 69-102**.

E. ZONING AND DEVELOPMENT BACKGROUND

The properties are located on the east side of Santiam Highway, 0.26 miles south of the intersection of Santiam Highway and Weatherly Lane, and 2.30 miles northwest of the city limits of Sweet Home and are identified on Linn County Tax Assessor maps as T13S, R01W, 23B, Tax Lots 200, 300, and 402.

The properties have been zoned Farm/Forest (F/F) since September 2, 1980. The properties were zoned Agriculture/Residential/Timber (ART) prior to September 2, 1980 and were developed with homesites. Tax lot 200 contained a site built dwelling, constructed in 1936, tax lot 300 contained a site built dwelling, constructed in 1925, and tax lot 402 contained a manufactured home, constructed in 1978. The dwellings were demolished in 2020 and 2021, when the applicant established a facility for the primary processing of forest products on the subject properties (land use file no. PD21-0066). Existing development on the subject properties includes an asphalt surface over four feet of compacted rock and internal circulation roads. The facility allows logs to be sorted, stacked, bucked, decked, and chipped on site prior to transferring the material to the adjacent wood products manufacturing operation.

The subject property is part of a tract of land that includes an adjacent 18-acre property identified as T13S, R01W, Section 23B, Tax Lot 100. Tax Lot 100 has been zoned Heavy Industrial (HI) since 1974. The existing operation consists of facilities for the manufacture of wood pellets, three rotary dryers, and a small log sawmill for merchandising, debarking, blocking, and chipping. The facility also includes a log veneer lathe, warehouses for finished

goods, a truck shop, and portable chipping equipment. The existing facility was developed in 2010 and currently has 40 employees.

II. PROPERTY CHARACTERISTICS

A. **SOIL TYPES** - The following is based upon information in the National Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), formerly the Soil Conservation Service (SCS), publication Soil Survey of Linn County Area, Oregon, July, 1987:

- B. **TOPOGRAPHY** – The property is predominately flat, with a small slope down towards the south side of the property.
- C. NATURAL FEATURES AND IMPROVEMENTS - An inventoried wetland is located on the southeast corner of tax lot 402.
- D. NATURAL AND/OR GEOLOGIC HAZARDS - A portion of the southeast corner of tax lot 402 is located within the designated flood hazard area according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study for Linn County, Oregon and Incorporated Areas dated September 29, 2010.

There are no potential geologic hazards identified on the subject properties (Bulletin 84, Environmental Geology of Western Linn County Oregon).

III. **ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS**

- WILDLIFE HABITAT The properties are not located within an identified big game habitat A. area. The properties do not contain any sensitive fish and riparian habitats.
- 8. **WETLANDS** – An inventoried wetland is located on the southeast corner of tax lot 402.

IV. **AVAILABILITY OF PUBLIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES**

- A. FIRE – The properties are located within the Sweet Home Rural Fire Protection District.
- B. **POLICE** - The Linn County Sheriff's Department provides police protection.
- C. SCHOOL - The properties are within the Sweet Home School District, the Linn Benton Lincoln Education Service District and the Linn Benton Community College District.
- D. OTHER DISTRICTS – The properties are located within the Sweet Home Cemetery District and the 4H Extension District.

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- **E. SEWAGE DISPOSAL** Sewer systems are provided on-site by a DEQ-approved sewer system.
- **F. WATER SUPPLY** Water systems are currently provided on-site by two existing wells located on the tract.
- G. ACCESS The property has frontage on Santiam Highway, a state highway. The applicant is in the process of obtaining a State Highway Approach permit to include the subject property in the existing grant of access for the adjacent HI-zoned property.

V. NOTICE TABLE AND PROCEDURE

A. NOTICE

Notice of this application was printed in the Albany Democrat-Herald newspaper at least 21 days prior to the hearing. Affected public agencies and owners of properties within 1,000 feet of the subject properties were also provided written notice of this application (**Exhibit D**). No comments have been submitted from surrounding property owners as of the time this staff report was prepared. One comment was received from an affected agency regarding the applications as of the date the staff report was prepared (**Exhibit C**). The following agencies have been provided notice and responded before this report was written.

B. PROCEDURE

The Planning Commission (Commission) conducted a public hearing to review the application on October 10, 2023 and made a recommendation to the Linn County Board of Commissioners (Board) to approve the applications.

The Board may consider the applications for 42 days from the close of the public hearing. Tabling of the request for a period not to exceed 35 days may also occur if the applicant consents. Specified findings, stating the reason for decision, are required in taking action on the proposed amendments. The Board will consider all the testimony in the matter and may take action to:

- 1. Approve the applications;
- 2. Deny the applications; or
- 3. Modify the applications.

All testimony and evidence must be directed toward the applicable decision criteria including applicable criteria in the plan or other land use regulations. Failure to raise an issue before the close of the record, or failure to provide statements or evidence sufficient to afford

the decision maker(s) and the parties an adequate opportunity to respond to each raised issue precludes an appeal based on that issue.

If additional documents or evidence are provided by any party, the Board may allow a continuance or leave the record open to allow the parties a reasonable opportunity to respond. Prior to the conclusion of the initial evidentiary hearing, any participant may request an opportunity to present additional evidence or testimony regarding the application. The Board shall grant the request by either (a) continuing the public hearing or (b) leaving the record open for additional written evidence or testimony. If the Board grants a continuance, the hearing shall be continued to a date, time and place certain at least seven days from the initial hearing. The 150-day time limitations of ORS 215.427 do not apply to the proposed amendments.

The Board hearing, which is scheduled for a date and time certain on November 21, 2023 at 10:00 a.m., in the Board Hearing Room, Room 200, on the second floor of the Linn County Courthouse is at least seven days from the initial Commission hearing and provides adequate opportunity to present additional evidence and testimony for the record.
