Tier 1 - 8 youth completed 147.50 hours of community service in 9 project days. In 2023 1 youth completed 8.25 hours of service during the same time period.


Tier 2 – 9 youth completed 125.50 hours of work crew in 9 project days. In 2023 12 youth completed 182.25 hours of service during the same time period.





Resolution & Order 2024-068: Linn County Parks is soliciting proposals for concessions and rentals in day use areas of our parks. This might include food/beverage trucks, recreational equipment rentals, and the like. We believe that this provides a benefit to the public, and that we do not have the staffing to be able to offer these concessions ourselves at this time.

The Road Department has the following items on the Board of Commissioners agenda for the weekly meeting on February 27, 2024. The following is a brief description of the items.

Resolution & Order 2024-059 – Memorandum of Understanding for the Delivery of State Highway Funds

This Resolution & Order is to approve a Memorandum of Understanding between Linn County and Oregon Cascades West Council of Government to disperse funds for the state highway fund exchange surface transportation block grant projects and delegate authority to Wayne Mink, Roadmaster. The project to be funded is the Goldfish Farm Road Improvement between Hwy 20 and Bridge 328-036. The remaining amount to be dispersed under this MOU is \$1,118,600.

Resolution & Order 2024-061 – Delegation of Authority, Purchase of Supplies Contract

This is a Resolution & Order to approve a delegation of authority to Wayne Mink, Roadmaster for purchase of liquid asphalt emulsion fog seal for the 2024 chip seals project. This purchase contract is between Linn County and Sierra Santa Fe Corporation in the amount of \$369,113.24.
