About the program:


The Life Skills Training research-Program is а based substance abuse prevention program for students. Life Skills is comprised of eight individual lessons focused on increasing knowledge and developing skills that will help students make positive decisions.

Linn County 4th Graders Report Improvement in Prevention Knowledge and Skills

Linn County Alcohol and Drug Prevention Program provided Life Skills Training to 649 4th grade students in Linn County Elementary Schools during the 2019-2020 school year. Students who completed Life Skills Training survey report having more of the skills they need to refuse alcohol and other drugs. Post-survev results indicate that 89% of

Linn County students report increased knowledge of decision-making skills, 88% report an increase of knowledge in refusal skills and 90% report an increase in knowledge related to the harmful effects of tobacco use. Furthermore, 87% report increased knowledge of stress reduction skills.
